

Position Title: Child Therapist – Fully Licensed

Department: Clinic

Reports to: Clinical Director

Hours: 32-40 hours per week, depending on desired workload.

Base Salary: \$66,560 - \$83,200 depending on hours.

Our mission: Jumping Mouse transforms children's lives by providing expressive mental health therapy for as long as necessary. We nurture each child's healthy development and supportive relationships at home and in the community.

In our Port Townsend based nonprofit agency, as well as our school-based satellites, we provide mental health services for children in Jefferson County, ages 2 to 12. Jumping Mouse takes referrals from a variety of sources in the community, as well as families. More than 80% of Jumping Mouse clients live in low-income households. No child is ever turned away if a family cannot pay for services.

Therapy at Jumping Mouse is non-directive, and long-term. We work with children for as long as needed and follow their lead in therapy, using expressive modalities such as sand tray, play, and art. At the core of our work, we hold a belief that through therapeutic relationship and play, children are able to process and integrate their experiences.

Our therapists work from a developmental, attachment based, depth oriented, and trauma-informed lens to support children who are suffering from a range of psychological difficulties and complex life experiences. Our therapists also work with parents and caregivers throughout the therapy process.

Each employee of Jumping Mouse Children's Center is integral to carrying out the organization's mission.

General Responsibilities include:

- Work with each child client weekly, on a consistent and predictable basis.
- Monthly meetings with the parents/guardians. Caseload of approximately 12-15 children depending on other duties. Children may be located at our main site, or Chimacum, and Brinnon satellite sites, travel to secondary sites will be accounted for in hours, and mileage will be reimbursed.
- Advocate for child clients in their environments (school, doctor, etc.)
- Assess the progress of clients in consultation with supervisor and consult group.
- Liaise on behalf of the child to teachers, schools, doctors, social workers, and GALS as needed.
- Write and maintain required records and reports pertaining to mental health services provided.
- Attend monthly staff meetings, weekly group consultations, monthly clinic meetings, and annual staff retreats.
- Retain current status on any legal and ethical requirements applicable to the maintenance of your license.
- Provide liaison services to school staff and administrators.
- Provide direct services to parents, as part of our parenting support program.
- Provide on-call clinical support for service requests, on a rotating basis, within agency hours.
- Provide written presentations materials, and clinical representation for fundraising and development purposes, including participation in community presentations.

Benefits:

- Yearly stipend for Professional Development.
- Weekly peer group consultation.
- Flexibility in scheduling when possible.
- Up to 3% employer matched retirement benefit.
- No or low contribution, Health insurance.
- Flexible vacation/leave policies.

Qualifications needed:

1. Graduate degree or higher degree in appropriate field and full licensure in the state of Washington as an LMHC, LMFT, or LICSW
2. Experience working with young children and their caregivers. Experience in depth-oriented work, child-directed sand tray and play therapy helpful.
3. An understanding of child development.
4. Ability to guide and support caregivers and other adults on behalf of the child's best interests.
5. Effective communication, interpersonal, and family advocacy skills.
6. Experience with electronic health records, Microsoft 365 or similar platforms, or a willingness to learn.

Work environment:
